THE NIGHT OWL

SKILL: RHYME, WRITING, AND READING COMPREHENSION:

RHYME- WORDS THAT SOUND SIMILAR WHEN YOU SAY THEM OR HEAR THEM.

AN EXAMPLE OF A RHYME: Little Boy Blue, come blow your horn; The sheep is in the meadow, the cow is in the corn. In the example sentence, the words <u>Horn</u> and <u>Corn</u> have a simallar sound, therefore, the sentence includes words that rhyme.
