Phonics: Consonant Blends

Consonant blends are when two consonants are side by side in a word, and you hear both sounds blended together. For example, in the story there is the consonant blend GR, as in great grandmother, Grenada, and granny. Another example is the blend FL, as in flight and flew.

See how many consonant blends you can find in the story. (Answers may vary.)

As a fun challenge, try writing a short story using consonant blends!

Rhymes

A rhyme is when the ending syllable of two or more words sound alike. For example the words blue and show, red and fed.
